

On that note, may you have fair winds and following seas, and for some of us, at least six inches of good clear ice.

Peter Georgas grew up in Waseca, a small town in southern Minnesota where his father owned the Crystal Café and Candy Kitchen. He earned a BA in Journalism from the University of Minnesota. TIN CAN TRIVIA

Question: What two ships are named for the same person yet have the ship name spelled differently and why?

Answer: USS Charles Ausburn and USS Charles Ausburne were both named for Electrician First Class Charles Lawrence Ausburne. He died while serving as radioman in the Army transport ANTILLES and staying at his post to the last. He was awarded the Navy Cross posthumously. His relatives were contacted about the naming of the first ship, DD-294 and they spelled the name Ausburn. A letter signed by Charles Ausburne showing that he spelled his name with the final "e" was discovered after the first ship was commissioned so the second ship, DD-570, was spelled as he spelled it.
